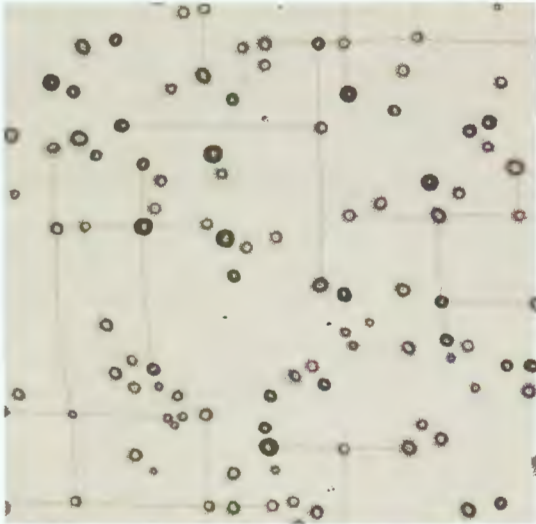

"This is a distillation of my favorite places, images, paintings and photos from memories of Paris in the 1960s," recalls interior designer Thomas Callaway of his new collection for Holland & Sherry. The Left Bank collection, printed on Belgian linen, boasts nine patterns in 46 colors. Nostalgic imagery of mountain villages in Provence, abstract vehicles entering a Parisian freeway, shadows cast by the mountains of Luberon and an artful take on Klimt's circles all come to life in a fresh, muted palette. hollandandsherry.com



"It is possible to touch luxury," muses architect Massimiliano Raggi, who has teamed up with Italian mosaics brand Sicis on the company's debut fabric line. The collection, introduced at Maison&Objet in Paris, looks to traditional Cosmati mosaic design for inspiration. Sumptuous velvets and viscose mixed with opaque cotton are handcrafted in Italy using a jacquard technique. "With this collection," says Raggi, "the intention is to conjure the emotions you feel from staring at a Sicis mosaic...with a textile." sicis.com —Mimi Faucett
