Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'" Take on this challenge: Have an impact on the Kingdom of God this summer. DO SOMETHING for someone else that takes some effort or sacrifice on your part. And, since he also challenged us to "change your routine," don't make it something within your normal areas of service. 




# B O O K R E V I E W



## Cynthia R. Chapman, *The World of Biblical Israel*

(The Great Courses, 2013), 12 audio CDs,  
twenty-four 30-minute lectures and  
Course Guidebook.

This set of lectures is presented in six historical units. The first addresses life during Babylonian Exile and the perpetuation of national identity through the familiar biblical stories of Abraham, Sarah, Jacob and Moses. Parts two and three describe the economic, political and social structures of ancient Israel and Judah. Parts four and five cover the conquest and exile under the Assyrians and Babylonians and the preservation of sacred texts that became the Bible. The final section sees the return of Judah to the "new Israel" and the people's restoration to their land and their God. Familiar stories of Abraham and Isaac, Jacob and his twelve sons, Job and others illustrate the historical context of ancient Israel to help us understand the setting for the Old Testament.
