From Our Interim Pastor Robert Schipul

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is quiet around here. Obadiah and part of the Team are in Chicago for the Annual Meeting of Lutheran Church Charities Comfort Dog Mission. Sandra and some of the VBS team are downstairs doing some preliminary planning for August 7,9,11 sessions here at CLC. And I am writing to you about our faith community.

This is an invitation to each and every one of you to consider your role in this faith community. WE are small in number but mighty in faith and Word and action. Of course, our first expectation is that we will find strength in the community. Here is where we share in the spiritual lives each brings to Worship. When I come to church, we want to be recognized by each other. That gives us our identity among fellow believers. We are encouraged by the teachings of our Lord Jesus to manage His treasures we receive and to return a portion of those for the ministrations of the church, and asking ourselves "How well to I manage the 'rest" of the treasures; because it is all HIS anyway.

Our faith community along with every other faith community is faced with the same questions. What must I do to reach people? In Sunday's Sermon (8/16) I spoke about Jesus' words about His "Kingdom." He told Pilate at his trial..."My Kingdom is not of this world." He told His disciples in Matthew 13:26ff. "My Kingdom though is IN this world." It is like a field planted with wheat that is expected to grow. There may be weeds along the way but concentrate on the wheat.

You and I are planted in this field called Earth. The expectation is that we will grow, mature and bear fruit for the Owner. We always speak about God's expectation of us but we also need to review our expectations of ourselves. Consider your expectation of being a part of the church. Do they measure up to God's expectations of you as a part of His "Kingdom" here on earth (His earth)? That is a valid question for me to ask you to consider. When you are able to answer the question of "Why am I here?" and "What does God expect of me as a member of Christ Lutheran Church?" then, I can begin to find joyful ways of serving Him here and in my life. Jesus expects us to be ACTIVE members of His KINGDOM not passive. He expects us to serve Him by serving others. Luther likens the local church to a "nest" or a "Safe House" where people on their search can find respite and welcome and safety and love.

I pray you find that here at Christ Lutheran and I am praying that you will discover all the Lord Jesus has in mind for you.

Celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation October 31, 1517.

Our Church and District and Synod will take time this fall to remember the blessings of the Reformation of the Christian Church, which began with the posting of the 95 Concerns (Theses) of the monk: Brother Martin Luther on the Chapel Door of the Church at Wittenberg, Germany on October 31, 1517. The only impression many have is about disruptions which were caused by the rift between Brother Martin Luther, a Professor at the University of Wittenberg and his immediate colleagues, superiors and finally the Pope in Rome. Few have discussed the benefits, blessings and lasting change these dialogues brought to the Christian community. During September, October and November, we will be looking at the change the Reformation brought, and the Counter Reformation in the Catholic Church and the distancing which occurred as other groups separated from the Lutheran position and formed what we refer to as the Protestant Reformation. We will spend some time discussing reformation-the phenomena which occurs about every 500 years since the dawn of written history and what implications that might have for this decade in the world. We are called to serve together by being willing to serve, by helping each other, by being generous with each other, by being humble with each other, by using our talents to bless each other, by sacrificing for each other, and by cooperating with each other.

We are called to worship together by worshiping weekly, by preparing for worship, by praying together, by giving our offerings together, and by celebrating together.

Over 610,000 pounds of food as well as thousands of items of clothing, coats and household items are distributed annually.


