FAMILY PHOTOS GAME PLAN

1 Figure out what time of day works best for you and your family.

That beautiful 'golden hour' (an hour before sunset) works for families who are not morning people. If you're morning people, then before noon is better for you. Although there are two 'golden hours' in a day, the morning one isn't very popular being so early!

Toddlers best time is right after their nap? No problem. I can find a location and good light when they're ready in the afternoon.

2 Book your photographer early!

You've figured out what works best for your family, now pick up the phone or send an email and make that appointment!

This may seem obvious, but most often with procrastination, the best spots are already filled up, especially in the busiest times of the year, near Graduation in May, and September to October for fall sessions for holiday photos. I do my best to accomodate as many sessions as possible, but waiting too long to book could result in not getting a time that works for your family, or not getting a spot at all!

3 Find a location that reflects your family's lifestyle.

Here's a little secret...you can find a great place almost anywhere to take a photo. Some of my favourite places around Prince George are from photo sessions in client's backyards or nearby parks. There are two things to consider: Will your family members feel comfortable enough to be themselves in the place you've chosen? Does the location fit your family's personality? (The grafitti wall down the alley probably won't work with those who are on the shy side.)

Pick your outfits with confidence.

Throw away the rules about picking clothing for your session. If evereyone is comfortable looking like themselves, great!

Just try to avoid stripes, prints and logos on tees. Wear clothes you feel confident in and you'll look and feel fabulous!

Clothes can be coordinated for colour harmony, but avoid matching outfits!
