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1. WHAT you want to display.

2. WHERE you want art.

The perfect coordination of artwork and design can take a room from ordinary to extraordinary. Popular places are living rooms, staircases, hallways, bedrooms, playrooms, and offices; other rooms that are great for family photos (but often neglected) are bathrooms and kitchens. This is your opportunity to express your family's style and personality! Take a moment to think about the room:

- Is the wood in the space dark, light or midtone?
- Are there any accent wall colors?
- Is the furniture and other decor neutral or are there pops of color?
- What other textures in the room can you coordinate with?

Points to remember about color when deciding where to display:

- The color in the space should work well with the images you are displaying there.
- When hanging multiple images, place images that have similar color tones together. A mix of contrasting colors in one gallery will make it feel haphazard and not by design.



3. HOW you want to display your art.

We love helping you decide what images from your session will go onto your walls! As we are choosing those images, it's also important to think about how you will want to display them. Think about the image and the room you have chosen and ask yourself:

 Do I like the look of a single statement piece on the wall, or would a grouping create more impact in this particular space?



SINGLEIMAGES

A single image is a clean, classic way to display a statement portrait. Make sure the image is large enough to cover the space. If you choose an image with a mat and frame, always make sure the finished frame size is big enough to cover the wall space and create that statement art piece you are looking for. A gallery wrapped canvas will make a 3-dimensional statement on the wall and can be hung without a frame, showing off a clean, modern look.



GROUPINGS

SYMMETRIC DISPLAYS

The even-keeled, predictable look of symmetrical displays is peaceful and logical. It is simple and easy to understand. Symmetry makes sense and gives our mind rest. It's a great way to tell a story with a series of images all in a row or spaced in a square layout.

ORGANIC DISPLAYS


Asymmetry creates interest and sparks curiousity in our brains. Disorder holds our interest and keeps our eyes wandering through the display. Going against the grain can be refreshing, but it's important to create them purposefully so they maintain a sense of balance.



Professional Tips for S U C C E S S

- 1) **BE DIFFERENT.** You don't have to hang everything in a conventional way. Experiment with different pieces hanging up, on a shelf, or overlapping each other.
- 2) **CREATE BALANCE.** Use coordinating (not necessarily matching) frames and print types.
 - A mix of gallergy-wrapped canvases with complimentary framed images all in the same color family
 - All prints have the same color frame (e.g., all white or all silver) in varying widths
 - All prints have matching frames with different mat widths
- 3) **BE SELECTIVE WITH SIZING.** For a cohesive wall grouping, choose two to three size options for your images. For example, 16x20s, 11x14s, and 8x10s are a great mix of sizes for a large wall gallery.
